All you need to know about the exhibition

How do the time slots work?

In order to limit traffic and allow visitors to experience as much works as possible, each day is divided into two or three time slots, depending of our opening hours. Each time slot limits access to 45 visitors for a period of three hours. We strongly recommend you to reserve your place in advance to guarantee access to the exhibition at the desired time and to reduce any waiting. Finally, if you want to get a ticket on the spot, know that it is possible that a waiting time is required to access the exhibition, depending on the availability of the next time slot.

How long should I plan to visit the exhibition?

We recommend at least two hours and a half to visit the exhibition. Note that due to the popularity of certain works and the participatory nature of the exhibition, a waiting time should be anticipated in order to experience certain works. Please arrive in the first thirty minutes of your time slot to try a maximum of experiences.

How can I get more information about the works and their creator(s)?

We provide visitors with an online guide, available free of charge at guide.phi.ca. Navigate throughout your visit to learn more about the works featured in *Particles of Existence*.

Can I wear glasses?

We strongly recommend contact lenses over glasses to optimize your experience.

What is virtual reality motion sickness?

Persons subject to motion sickness also run the risk of feeling nauseous when using a VR headset. These visitors should pay particular attention to this warning. Much like the sensation felt after disembarking from a cruise ship, symptoms from exposure to virtual reality headsets may persist or become more intense a few hours after the experience. We recommend that visitors close their eyes or take a break as soon as they notice symptoms, and do not hesitate to consult attendants in case of discomfort.
